(Male) Youth of the Year

The son of Bill and Langley Newman Lindsley of Destin, Miller filled his application with activities and awards he has achieved in his academic career as well as an impressive GPA, and was awarded \$3,500 total to further his education, which he plans to pursue at Georgia Tech. He is now eligible to compete for \$15,000 at the National Exchange Club level.

Arianna Dali, a senior at Chcotawhatchee High School, was named the 2023-24 (Female) Youth of the Year by the Emerald Coast Exchange Club. Arianna, who has a 4.77 GPA, is also active in community service, including leading the school's Excel Club (the high school level Exchange) as president. Whether she packed bags for the Children's Advocacy Center, worked a food distribution, or spearheaded an effort to improve the school's Freedom Shrine, Arianna shines in both academics and character. She received \$1,000 to help further her education, which she intends to pursue at University of Florida.

April: Child Abuse Prevention Month



The Okaloosa Board of County Commissioners issued a proclamation on Tuesday to designate April 16, 2024 as "EXCHANGE CLUB CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION DAY". Child abuse is a serious community problem and finding solutions depends on involvement among people throughout the community, and the Emerald Coast Exchange Club, Niceville Exchange Club, FWBHS Excel Club, Choctaw High School Excel Club and Meigs Middle School Jr Excel Club through its support of parent aide programs, parenting classes, educational programs and community service activities, is assisting in making significant progress in stopping this crime against families and children.



Shalimar's Mayor and Town Commission joined with David Lambert, Emerald Coast Exchange Club President-Elect, for the reading of a proclamation. Mayor Franks proclaimed April as Child Abuse Prevention Month and urged all citizens to engage in activities that strengthen families and communities to provide an optimal environment for the development of happy and healthy children.

Pinwheel gardens are used to help educate communities about the importance of supporting children and families and to raise awareness for the many local children facing abuse and neglect. Pinwheels are symbolic to the prevention effort and the hope, health and happiness each child deserves. Pinwheel gardens represent our effort to focus on community activities that support families and public policies that prioritize prevention right from the start to make sure child abuse and neglect never occur.
