

From Our City Directors

Tel Mond Featured in Miami Area Presentation

On January 31, Kim Sheintal (Assistant City Director for Tel Mond) gave a Zoom presentation with photos about the Jews of Sarasota-Manatee sponsored by the Jewish Genealogical Society of Greater Miami and Temple Beth Am of Pinecrest, Florida. Tel Mond was highlighted during the presentation.

In her presentation Kim said, "Many leading Israeli hi-tech executives reside in Tel Mond, which is largely surrounded by lovely orange groves. Like Sarasota, Tel Mond supports a range of cultural interests and has a considerable senior citizen population. Ever since Tel Mond became a Sarasota Sister City in 1999, the communities have enjoyed a mutually beneficial relationship. These areas include student exchanges, group visits and civic projects. With a population of 13,000, Tel Mond is centrally located between Tel Aviv and Haifa."

A 1952 photo of Lou Ann Rosengarten as a teenager performing in Sarasota's Sailor Circus was featured. Lou Ann Rosengarten, now known as Lou Ann Palmer, was Sarasota's second Jewish mayor. In 1997, four Sarasota college students were selected to work at a summer camp in Tel Mond. The four students wanted to share a feel for Sarasota's history with Tel Mond. Because of Sarasota's strong connection to the circus, they borrowed clown costumes from the Sailor Circus and dressed as clowns one day for camp.

A 1991 photo featured the Schoenbaum family celebrating Brian Schoenbaum's Bar Mitzvah in Tel Mond. The family proudly posed in front of the Betty and Alex Schoenbaum Regional Library in Tel Mond. The Tel Mond community's highly regarded local library is named for legendary Sarasota philanthropists, Alex and Betty Schoenbaum. In 1993, the Schoenbaum Regional Library was recognized by the state of Israel as the best small library in the country.

In 1982 Tel Mond became part of a new project called Project Renewal. Project Renewal was formed to rehabilitate distressed neighborhoods in Israel. Following exploratory visits by Jay Saphier, Linda Rosenbluth and Jack Weintraub, the Sarasota-Manatee community took on a five-year commitment for a campaign to raise funds for Tel Mond. Tel Mond was twinned with the community of Sarasota. Coordination, visitations, exchanges and dialogue between many citizens in the community brought a new understanding to relationships within both communities. This commitment was extended through various visits and special projects. A twenty-three member delegation from Sarasota went to Tel Mond Israel in 1983. Tel Mond plays an important part of the history of Sarasota-Manatee.

The Sister City of Mérida
THE "CASA MERIDA" PROJECT

SCAS is working with our sister city of Mérida, México in conjunction with the Ringling Museum to bring the project "Casa Mérida" to Sarasota. The project will showcase the city of Mérida through its arts, handicrafts, gastronomy, jewelry, textiles, and stone and wood art for about one or two months in Sarasota as a pop-up event. During the "Casa Mérida" exhibition showroom, there would be events such as dance, music, and cooking classes. This event is planned to take place in either December 2021, January or February of 2022. This project already has the approval of the Mayor of Mérida. We are looking to get the support of the City of Sarasota through Mayor Hagen Brody.

The director of the Ringling, Steven High, mentioned that they can support the "Casa Mérida" project for certain events to take place at the Ringling Museum but suggested that the project showroom be held in a more central location in downtown Sarasota to capture a broader audience.

We will keep you informed with the progress of the project.

PERPIGNAN, France — Riding high in the polls ahead of the next presidential election, feeling they've won the battle over ideas, smelling blood in the Élysée Palace, leaders of France's far right cocked their eyes across the land at perhaps the one thing standing between them and power: beavers.

That is what some French call the voters who, time and again, have cast political differences aside and put in power anyone but farright candidates — <u>raising a dam against them</u> as real beavers do against predators. Voters did precisely that in 2014 in Perpignan, a medieval city of pastel-color buildings on the Mediterranean near the border with Spain.
