I look forward to our Executive Council meeting to review our upcoming events, and meeting all our members, once again.

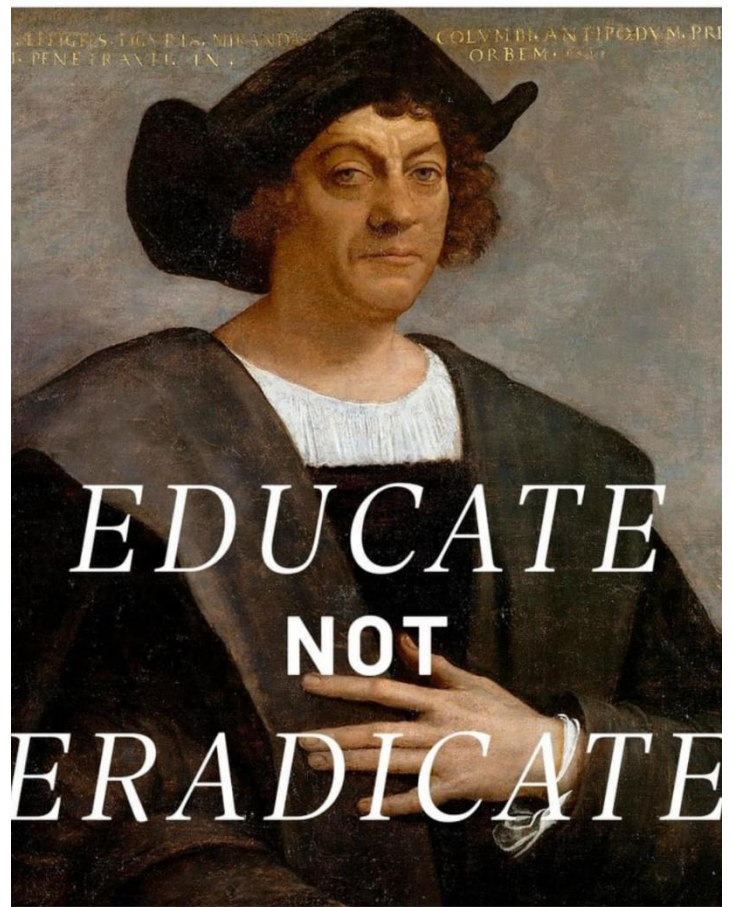
The July social gathering attendance was very impressive. Everyone enjoyed the food and the summer social gatherings. Thank you, Maddie.

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Cappuccino- the drink was named because its color resembles the brown color of the robes worn by the Capuchin order of Franciscan friars. Others say it is because of the *cappuccio* or hood of the friar's robes.

Cappuccino Mouse

- 1C milk
- $\frac{3}{4}$ C cold strong coffee
- 1 pkg vanilla pudding mix
- 2 TB sugar
- 2 C heavy cream
- $\frac{1}{4}$ C sugar

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1. Beat milk, coffee, pudding mix and 2 TB sugar for 2 min slightly thicken
 2. Beat heavy cream in cold bowl with $\frac{1}{4}$ C sugar at high speed till stiff
 3. Gently stir whip cream into coffee mixture
 4. Refrigerate 15 min
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
