FOOD, DESSERT, COFFEE

POOR MAN'S CAKE

- 3 C flour
- 2 C water
- 1/3 C shortening
- 2 C raisins
- 1 C brown sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp ground cloves
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp baking powder

1 C walnuts

- Heat even to 225
- Heat oven to 325
- Grease and flour bundt pan
- Place water, shortening, raisings, sugar, cinnamon and cloves in saucepan. Over medium heat cook and boil for 5 min.
- Cool completely
- Mix flour and baking powder in large bowl
- Dissolve baking soda in 1tsp water
- Add raisins mixture and baking soda mixture to flour mixture.
- Add nuts
- Spoon into prepared pan
- Bake 50 min. to 1 hour
- Cool 15 min before placing on rack

Frost with your choice of topping or:

- 2 TB melted butter 2 C powdered sugar 2-4 TB milk
- 1 tsp vanilla

In bowl mix melted butter with powdered sugar, milk and vanilla till blended and thick drizzle consistency. Add milk as needed. Spoon over cake.

ITALIAN CULTURE CORNER

Cristoforo Colombo was born in Genoa in 1451. At that time, Genoa was a naval power and independent republic that rivaled Venice and traded with the Orient.

He took his first sea voyage at the age of 14. Later he studies navigation in Greece and mapmaking in Portugal.

Columbus presents his plan to reach the Orient by sailing west across the AtlaIntic to the kings of Portugal, England, France and Spain. Only Spain King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella accept his offer. It takes Columbus six years to convince them to underwrite his explorations.

On October 12, 1492 at two o'clock in the morning, land is sighted.

Columbus crossed the Atlantic four times in 10 years: 1492, 1493, 1498, and his last in 1502.

Why does Columbus Day matter?

It matters because after Columbus came millions of other Europeans who brought their art, music, science, medicine, philosophy and religious principles to America.

Columbus matters because his holiday recognizes not only the achievements of a great Renaissance explorer, but the success of the millions of immigrants from all over the world, including Europe, who followed him, seeking religious freedom, political stability and the chance to give their children a better life. Columbus Day is a reminder that from its earliest beginnings, the struggling American republic found its inspiration in the figure of Columbus. In fact, October 12th is one of America's oldest holidays, first celebrated in 1792 on the 300th anniversary of his first voyage.

In the early years of the American republic, Columbus was an American icon, admired as much as George Washington and Thomas Jefferson. The Capitol was named after him.

By the 19th century, Columbus had become a symbol of American Patriotism. The Pledge of Allegiance was written in 1892 in honor of the 400th anniversary of his first voyage. Also that year, President Harrison declared Columbus Day a legal holiday.
