St. Frances Xavier Cabrini feast day is celebrated in the US on November 13. She ministered in the United States as a missionary sister to the Italian immigrants. St. Cabrini was born in the town of Sant'Angelo Lodigiano in Lombardy, Italy.

This northern area of Italy is known for rustic cuisine characterized by less use of olive oil, pasta and tomato sauce and more use of butter, rice, corn (for polenta) and cheeses for cream sauces.

ASPARAGI AL FORNO

1 lb. asparagus

Salt and pepper

3 TB butter

½ C freshly grated parmigiano Reggiano

- 1 Clean acharague trimming off ande
 - 1. Clean asparagus, trimming off ends
 - 2. Place in lightly salted boiling water
 - 3. Cook for 8 minutes over medium heat
 - Drain and place in a buttered baking dish with salt & pepper
 - 5. Drizzle melted butter over the top and sprinkle with Parmesan
 - 6. Bake in preheated oven 350 for 6-7 min.

THANKSGIVING

The American holiday is particularly rich in legend and symbolism, and the traditional fare of the Thanksgiving meal typically includes turkey, bread stuffing, potatoes, cranberries, and pumpkin pie.

In 1827, the noted magazine editor and writer <u>Sarah Josepha Hale</u>—author of the nursery rhyme "Mary Had a Little Lamb"—launched a campaign to establish Thanksgiving as a national holiday. For 36 years, she published numerous editorials and sent scores of letters to governors, senators, presidents and other politicians, earning her the nickname the "Mother of Thanksgiving."

Abraham Lincoln finally heeded her request in 1863, at the height of the <u>Civil</u> War, in a proclamation entreating all Americans to ask God to "commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife" and to "heal the wounds of the nation."

He scheduled Thanksgiving for the final Thursday in November.


