I have been a member of SOI for 12 years. During that time, I've enjoyed the camaraderie in a wide variety of activities. I have served on the board as a Chaplin and Historian. I also help with fundraising activities including wreath sales, bar tending and more.

"Napa Nick" Sanza's Biography

Right out of high school Nick Sanza entered the U.S. Army 2nd and 15th Infantry, 3rd Division working in teletype and in decoding/crypto. He served during the Cold War in the Berlin Border Patrol in Wildflecken at the East and West German boarder and three other tours of duty.

Nick's family had four generations in the U.S. Army: His grandfather rode with the Rough Riders during the Spanish-American War; his father is the last driver for General George Patton from the beaches of Normandy to the outskirts of Berlin during World War II; and his son was a sniper in Special Forces during the Iraq and Afghanistan conflict and gave his life for his country.

Prior to Nick entering the film and television industry, he played semi-professional football for the farm team of the Oakland Raiders. Later he became a professional scout for the Memphis Showboats, which was part of the United States Football League, setting up mini camps for NFL agents.

Nick Sanza is known in the entertainment industry as "Napa Nick". He started in the film and television industry with the television series Falcon Crest (CBS) as a second unit production manager, location scout and script development. During his time with Falcon Crest from 1982 to 1989 he also was a stuntman and stunt coordinator for Francis Coppola Productions, Paramount Studios, Castle Rock Production (Rob Reiner), NBC, CBS, Universal Television Productions and Dick Wolf Productions.

When Falcon Crest went off the air, Nick became a production manager, location manager and stuntman for over 60 national commercials and "Movie of the Week" for ABC, CBS, NBC, Fox and Universal Studio Television Productions.

In 1992 Barbara Walters, working for ABC, hired Nick as a production manager and location manager to set up a television special for ABC's 20/20 spotlighting Julia Roberts who was filming in the Napa Valley in a feature film called "Dying Young". Two months after this special was aired, Nick was hired as a producer and investigative journalist for ABC's Good Morning America. This is the main show for Nick, but occasionally he produces for Primetime, World News, Night Line and the Academy Awards (Oscars).

At the present, "Napa Nick" and his partner, Cassandra Cooper have developed two new TV series. Their current production is "Beyond the Front Lines – Stories From Real American Heroes", which will be shot in Washington, D.C. and Pearl Harbor with surviving World War II veterans telling their stores of the front lines from the Pacific against the Japanese and the German Nazis in Europe.

The other TV show still in development is called "Wine and Grind Adventures", which will be shot in the Hawaiian Islands and major and exotic world-wide locations where top movies were shot. This show will be shot at Sony Studios and Hollywood locations.

Hi everyone!

Mi presento, sono Alessandra, la vostra traduttrice!

Sebbene infatti io e Agnese concordiamo sui contenuti delle cartoline assieme il mio è spesso un lavoro unicamente di supporto.

Let me introduce myself, I'm Alessandra, your translator!

In fact, although Agnese and I agree on the contents of the postcards together, mine is often only a support job.

Ho 27 anni, abito a Venaria Reale, in provincia di Torino, ma come Agnese sono nata ad Arezzo. Ho vissuto tre anni a Bologna studiando cooperazione, poi mi sono trasferita dove al momento vivo per specializzarmi in antropologia. E in religioni, come anche in intelligenza artificiale.

I am 27 years old, I live in Venaria Reale, in the province of Turin, but like Agnese I was born in Arezzo. For three years, I lived in Bologna studying cooperation, then I moved to where I currently live to specialize in anthropology. And in religions, as well as in artificial intelligence.

Sono una persona molto curiosa, da quando ho 17 anni ho preso parte a vari progetti di volontariato e ho cominciato a viaggiare. Sono stata in alcuni stati europei, Medio Oriente, Asia, Africa e recentemente ho anche avuto modo di conoscere una parte del continente americano.

I am a very curious person, since I was 17 I have taken part in various volunteer projects and started travelling. I have been to some European states, the Middle East, Asia, Africa and recently I also got to know a part of the American continent.

Al momento infatti mi trovo in Brasile, sto svolgendo un anno di Servizio Civile Universale a Juazeiro in Bahia. Mi occupo di diritto alla salute e lavoro in un Centro di Terapie Naturali. Oltre a questo faccio ricerche sulle religioni afro-brasiliane e sulle strategie di resistenza delle comunità tradizionali.

In fact, I am currently in Brazil, doing a year of Universal Civil Service in Juazeiro in Bahia. I deal with health rights and work in a Natural Therapies Centre. In addition to this, I research Afro-Brazilian religions and the resistance strategies of traditional communities.

Per me scrivervi ogni mese rappresenta un'oppotunità unica di connetterci pur essendo lontani. Condividere assieme ad Agnese la storia del nostro paese e le nostre tradizioni è un piccolo privilegio di cui sono grata e che spero di riuscire a portare avanti.

For me, writing to you every month represents a unique opportunity to connect despite being far away. Sharing the history of our country and our traditions together with Agnese is a small privilege for which I am grateful and which I hope to be able to carry forward.
