I was born in Albany, California on September 9, 1941. Interestingly, a cousin of mine was born nine hours later. My family heritage is three fourths Portuguese and a quarter Spanish. My family history in Fairfield goes back a long way. My grandfather used to own the land that is now the parking lot for the Fairfield Arts and Convention Center. In 1948, my family bought ten acres of land that you might remember as the "Sullivan School Hill". We had several thousand chickens along with cows, sheep and pigs. Many of your families may have bought eggs from us. We sold the ranch to the City of Fairfield in 1964. We were allowed to stay there until 1968 when the City of Fairfield was ready to take ownership.

While the ranch was producing all those eggs, I graduated from Armijo High School in 1960. A couple years later I started working in landscape maintenance for the Fairfield Parks and Recreation Department. I worked there for 36½ years. By the time I retired in 1999, I was responsible for maintaining 180 acres of landscape every week.

My first wife and I had a son and a daughter. My second wife and I had a son. My children have blessed me with 14 grandchildren and five great grandchildren and are not done yet. I am very proud of my second wife who was a Captain in the Air Force, stationed at Travis Air Force Base. She was the WAC squadron leader at Travis during the 1971 riots. After leaving the Air Force she became a music teacher here in Fairfield.

Several years after my second wife died I moved to Vacaville with my lady who is also a member of the Sons and Daughters of Italy (SOI). I joined the SOI in 2009 when they allowed people like me to join. My friend, Bill Columbano, sponsored me to become a member. We are also members of the Fairfield Bocce Federation where I am a team captain, the Moose, Sons in Retirement, Native Sons of the Golden West and many other organizations. If you've ever noticed pop tabs being collected at the monthly SOI meetings, those who know me know that I collect them for Ronald McDonald House in Sacramento to help raise funds for sick children and their families.

We also enjoy keeping old family traditions alive. Among those traditions are making sausage with many of you and curing our own green olives the way our grandparents did.

Do you know who I am?

Hint #1: My first name is the same as a famous 1950s cowboy, ____ Rogers, whose signature song was "Happy Trails".

Hint #2: My last name is similar to the name of the red thing they stuff in green cocktail olives.

School Supply Drive 2024

The Sons and Daughters of Italy donated school supplies with an approximate value of \$305 and I received cash donations of \$565 for a total of \$870. With the \$500 in matching funds from yours truly, I had \$1,065 to spent on school supplies. All together Anna Kyle Elementary School received school supplies valued at \$1,373.

I spent a total of \$1,067 on 20 packages of dry erase markers, 65 dry board erasers, 4 grading stamp sets, 30 notebooks, 15 packages of pens, 12 packages of pencils, 24 packages of cap erasers, 4 packages of multipurpose paper, a package of cardstock paper and 3 Scotch Thermal Laminating machines with 10 packages of laminating pouches for the machines and I only spent \$3 over the collected amount. The donated school supplies included 7 backpack pins, 5 binder pouches, an expandable file folder, 2 packages of fasteners, 27 glue sticks, 2 novelty organizer trays, 28 pairs of children's scissors, 1 package of index cards, a package of paper, 12 packages of color pencils, 12 packages of Post It Notes, 8 pocket portfolios and 12 rolls of paper towels.

From the list above, you can see I had a lot of school supplies in my house. This year I boxed up almost all the school supplies, loaded them in the trunk of my car and took them to Anna Kyle in mid-August. All those packages of paper and laminating pouches were very heavy. I called ahead and Betty Jo Ortiz was waiting for me with a cart so I didn't have to lug them as far as I did last year. When I got down to the last \$200, I asked the school if they had any specific requests again and the answer was dry board erasers. It's been over three weeks and I'm still waiting for my order of 60 dry board erasers from Walmart. Who knew that dry board erasers are a high demand item? Hoping to get the eraser to Anna Kyle soon.

I am impressed with the generosity of the SOI members. Great job supporting the teachers of Anna Kyle Elementary School!
