On behalf of the Executive Committee and all members of IGFR, every good wish is extended to Carl and Ruth Miller in the future.



HISTORY OF INTERNATIONAL GOLFING FELLOWSHIP OF ROTARY

When Carl Miller was president of Rotary International in 1963/64, he stressed the development of Fellowship between Rotarians. Part of his program was called Matched District Program, a program of getting Rotarians in one part of the world together with Rotarians in other parts of the world for better understanding and goodwill between people. He spent a great deal of time encouraging what is now known as World Fellowship Activity, and one of the activities which he sponsored is the International Golfing Fellowship of Rotary.

In 1963, at the final dinner of the International World Assembly at Lake Placid, New York, the Governor-elect of District 101 (Scotland), Gavin Reekie was at the table of the incoming Rotary International President, Carl Miller. Gavin Reekie explained to Carl Miller about a golf match that was being played between District 728 (Pennsylvania) and District 101 (Scotland), which had all started years before because of a happy meeting between Rotarian Peter Jackson of Scotland and Rotarian Ken Christy of Butler, Pennsylvania. He suggested that Rotary International should take up this idea on a World basis. Carl Miller said, "Yes, we must do this and when I visit your District, we must 'tie up the details'." (It should be noted here that other areas of the world had held similar exchanges of golf fellowship, particularly Crans, Switzerland, where Gaston Barras had been holding tournaments for Rotarians from France, Belgium, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg and Switzerland since 1951.)

The meeting took place August 17th, 1963, at the famous Gleneagles Hotel, Scotland. Present were: Carl Miller, President; Bill Carter, President, RIBI; Gavin Reekie, District Governor 101 (Scotland); Willie McAslian, District Governor 102 (Scotland).

President Carl solicited the assistance of Gavin Reekie and Willie McAslian, for Carl wished to hold the First World Rotary Golf Championship on the Royal and Ancient Golf Club at St. Andrews. Gavin and Willie returned to Scotland and engaged the help of Willie Milne, who was then Sports Director for both Rotary Districts of Scotland.

President Carl offered to put a gold and silver perpetual trophy, to be known as the Carl Miller Trophy, and to provide a replica of the trophy each year for the winner to keep personally. Willie Milne arranged with Cairnsmith Silversmiths in Perth to design the Carl Miller Trophy. Drafts were sent back and forth until final approval by Carl, who added dimples in the globe to represent golf ball and tees, to hold the globe. The Carl Miller Trophy and the replicas given each year represent an investment of more than \$6,000 since the first tournament.

The trophy was first played for on the historic Old Course at St. Andrews, Scotland, in September of 1964, and this course was also chosen for the second year in 1965.

Since that time, the number of trophies has grown to eight: The Charles Piat Trophy for the player with the lowest gross score; the Gavin Reekie Trophy awarded to the runner-up to the Carl Miller Trophy; the Malcolm Miller Trophy awarded to the runner-up to the Charles Piat Trophy; the Joe Gherzi Trophy awarded to the player with the lowest net score in the 13-18 Division; the Gaston Barras Trophy awarded to the winning District Team with the lowest total gross score; the F. Folonari Trophy awarded to the District Team with the lowest total net score; the Lars Magnusson Trophy awarded for the most holes-in-one, most eagles, or most birdies by any player.

Since the founding of the International Golfing Fellowship of Rotarians, twelve tournaments have been held: four in the United States, three in Scotland, and one each in Switzerland, Sweden, Italy, Australia and France. There were so many imponderables in the organizations of each of these tournaments, it was difficult to foresee all the problems which were likely to rear their heads. Each of these tournaments have been organized and staged by members of the International Executive Committee, under the guidance of President C.D. Tinsley; Vice President Charles Piat; Secretary Willie Milne, and Treasurer Jack Bushong. I.G.F.R. is indebted to the following for their great help in organizing tournaments: Gavin Reekie, Willie McAslan, David Cooper, John Caithness and Willie Milne, who organized the first meeting in St. Andrews; C.D. Tinsley, Gaston Barras, Switzerland; Jack Bushong, Bill McCune, John Dibb and Stewart Kennedy in the United States; G.L. Gherzi in Italy, Jack Grey, Australia, and Rene Bouchy in France. Malcolm Miller, as Treasurer and Chairman of the Rules and Regulations Committee, has contributed greatly to I.G.F.R. success.

At the 1975 World Rotary Golf Championship at Pinehurt, North Carolina, Morley Theaker of Hawaii was added to the Executive Committee as a temporary member through the Hawaii Tournament, and a new slate of officers was elected as follows:

Life Honorary President Chairman of the Board President Vice President Executive Secretary Treasurer Carl P. Miller, U.S.A. C. D. Tinsley, U.S.A. Charles Piat, France Jack Bushong, U.S.A. Willie Milne, Scotland Jack Grey, Australia

The 1976 World Rotary Golf Tournament will be held in Maui, Hawaii, U.S.A., May 23-29, 1976, with play on the championship golf course at Kaanapali Beach.

Rotarians in many parts of the world are looking forward to the privilege of having the World Rotary Golf Championship in the years ahead, including Luxembourg, 1977, where Armand Delvaux of the Executive Committee has his home; Mexico City, Mexico, where Arturo Alvarez of the Executive Committee has his home, and Japan, where executive committeeman Tameyoshi Arakawa resides.

CHRONOLOGICAL NOTES OF I.G.R.F.

AUGUST 17, 1963

One of the first organizing meetings between Carl Miller, Gavin Reekie and Willie McAslan, at Gleneagles, Scotland.

SEPTEMBER 22, 1964

1st International Golfing Fellowship of Rotary Golf Tournament at St. Andrews, Scotland.

A "Carl Miller Necktie" was presented to each competitor in the first meeting at St. Andrews. The tie was of the MacFarlane tartan (Miller is a sept of Clan MacFarland).

After the first tournament at St. Andrews, it was suggested that future competitions should be made more strictly a District one by asking each District to send two competitors; in fact, a District Team.

OCTOBER, 1964

Charles Piat of France would like to present a trophy for the best gross score.

Suggested that the 1965 tournament should be at St. Andrews again, in order, that the competition might be firmly established.

OCTOBER, 1966 - RICE HOTEL, HOUSTON, TEXAS

Carl Miller proposed that an Executive should be formed. He expressed a wish that he should not be the president of such an Executive, but the meeting was unanimous in the wish that he should continue in office, even if it were as Honorary President with someone else as President of the Executive.

It was decided to appoint a small committee to propose an Executive and Ed Bracher, Tom Dickson and Erik Magnusson were appointed. They retired from the meeting and returned with the following proposals which were accepted:

President C. D. Tinsley, Texas, USA

Secretary Willie Milne, Scotland

John Dibb — North Carolina, USA

Gaston Barras — Switzerland Stan Williams — Australia Arturo Alvarez — Mexico

Kurt Eggman - Orange Free State (South Africa)

Bill Godbey — California, USA

Charles Piat — France
Erik Magnusson — Sweden
Tom Dickson — Scotland
G. L. Gherzi — Italy
J. H. Bruce Barry — Canada

It was later decided the Executive would be strengthened by the inclusion of Malcolm Miller of Kansas who had been at all three meetings.

It was agreed to recommend to the Executive that in future competitions, there should be two classes of competitors:

- (1) Handicaps up to and including 12 for the Carl Miller Trophy;
- (2) Handicaps from 13 to 18 for a trophy not yet in existence.

It was also suggested that all previous winners should have the right to play in the competition without disturbing their District's right to nominate representatives.

Finance: A small surplus of \$75.00 was reported. It was thought that the Executive should consider the question of an entry fee.

It was suggested that the Executive should meet once a year, if possible away from the tournament — perhaps New York.

SEPTEMBER, 1967 — CRANS, SWITZERLAND

Charles Piat presents miniatures of his trophy to be awarded to the winner of the low gross score of the 0 thru 12 Handicap.

It is decided the 1969 tournament is to be held in Sweden; and the 1970 tournament for Venice, Italy, would be voted on next year in Palm Springs, California.

It is decided that Malcolm Miller should draw up a set of rules.

The Executive Committee is to try to get official recognition from Rotary International.

Jack Grey (Australia) recommended for membership to the Executive Committee to replace Stan Williams (Australia).

NOVEMBER, 1968 — PALM SPRINGS, CALIFORNIA USA

Malcolm Miller, Kansas, USA, appointed Treasurer.

Malcolm Miller presents to the Executive the first rules of IGFR.

Masa W. Oka of Japan appointed to membership of Executive Committee.

It is suggested there should be a photographic record of the tournaments kept.

AUGUST, 1969 - TYLOSAND, SWEDEN

It was decided the 1970 meeting was to be held in Venice, Italy.

Probable place of the 1971 meeting to be in Australia.

NOVEMBER, 1969 — LONDON, ENGLAND

Sub-committee meeting: Gaston Barras, Switzerland; Marco Gherzi, Italy; Lars Magnusson, Sweden; Willie Milne, Scotland. A diploma presented by the International Golfing Fellowship of Rotary should be awarded to each class winner from each District represented at the annual tournament of any national or regional golfing fellowship. Lars Magnusson promised to prepare a sample diploma.

A jacket badge similar to the existing I.G.F.R. badge should be made available to all members.

SEPTEMBER, 1970 — VENICE, ITALY

Stan Williams, Australia, has passed away.

Lars Magnusson, Sweden, presents diploma for District Fellowship.

Future competitions: Agreed that arrangements were Melbourne, Australia — 1971; Houston, Texas, in 1972 and Evian, France — 1973. Also, 1974 competition might return to St. Andrews, Scotland.

1971 - MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA

Passing of Director Masa Oka.

Confirmed the appointments of Dr. Bill McCune and Mr. Tokisure Yokogawa

to the Executive Committee.

Future competition was approved for 1974 at St. Andrews, Scotland.

The Executives have a recommendation before them that they should try to find someone in their area who is willing and able to become Regional or National Chairman of a Golfing Fellowship of Rotary.

The Executives accepted an invitation of member Jack Bushong to meet in Galveston, Texas, for a few days (as his guests) prior to the Houston Fellowship next year.

1972 - HOUSTON, TEXAS, USA

Future competitions: An invitation was received for 1975 for Pinehurst, North Carolina, from John Dibb; also, Mexico - 1976 (Alvarez) and Australia - 1977 (J. Grey).

New officers to be elected in Evian 1973.

Mr. Yokogawa was dropped from Executive Committee, due to his inability to participate.

Two new members were added to the Committee: Tameyoshi Arakawa from Japan; Armand Delvaux from Luxembourg.

Much interest was shown in the formation of National Fellowships throughout the world.

1973 - EVIAN, FRANCE

Any decision regarding the future office bearers was deferred until St. Andrews, when Charles Piat would give a final decision regarding his acceptance of the post of President.

Lars Magnusson, Sweden, presented two designs for Fellowship diplomas, one of which was selected.

It was agreed that the 1975 competition would be held in Pinehurt, North Carolina, and the 1976 tournament should take place in Hawaii.

Verbal invitations were received from Canada, Australia, Japan, Luxembourg and Mexico.

It was again pointed out that a formal invitation has to follow specific lines; i.e., there has to be a letter from the District Governor, from the President of the Rotary Club which is running the competition, from the golf course accepting such a tournament and proof of acceptable accommodations.

The meeting confirmed members of the Executive Committee.

John Dibb would like to resign after the tournament in North Carolina, and nominated Stuart Kennedy as his replacement.

Jack Bushong is appointed assistant to both the Secretary and the Treasurer.

It was approved that Stuart Kennedy be co-opted as a member of the Executive to cover the period up to and including the next tournament at Pinehurst.

It was confirmed that in 1976 the tournament would be held in Hawaii, probably the last week in May.

It was confirmed that the 1977 tournament would be held in Luxembourg.

Jack Bushong is appointed Treasurer. Malcolm Miller to remain a member of the Executive.

It was decided to appoint a sub-committee to clear up some points in the rules and regulations. A European sub-committee consisting of Gaston Barras, Armand Delvaux and Gavin Reekie would send their findings to the President who would chair an American committee consisting of C. D. Tinsley, Jack Bushong and when possible, Bill McCune.

1975 - PINEHURST

It is agreed that holding a Rotary meeting at the World Championship should be arranged by the sponsoring committee.

Agreed that any Executive Member who is missing from the Executive Meeting on two successive years shall be deemed to have resigned commencing with Hawaii, 1976.

Applications were forwarded from South Africa and Australia for the 1978 tournament to be decided at Hawaii.

Charles Piat is appointed President of I. G. F. R.

C. D. Tinsley is appointed Chairman of the Executive Committee.

Jack Bushong is appointed Vice President.

Willie Milne agreed to continue as Secretary for a further period of one year.

Jack Grey is appointed Treasurer.

Malcolm Miller appointed Chairman of Rules and Regulations.

Bill McCune appointed Historian to compile a history and record of I.G.F.R. from the beginning.

1976 - MAUI, HAWAII

A resolution was passed with sorrow on the passing of Mae Milne.

Judd Hall was appointed Chairman for the Area Fellowship of the USA.

Bill McCune selected Chairman of the Rules and Regulations Committee.

Any member of the Executive Committee missing two consecutive meetings (starting with Hawaii 1976) would have deemed to have resigned from the Committee.

Future competitions under consideration:

- (1) 1978 South Africa Hermanus 1978 - Australia - Melbourne
- (2) 1979 Pebble Beach, California

The downtown Rotary Club of Houston, Texas, USA, presents to I.G.F.R. a special trophy in honor of C.D. Tinsley for the outstanding contributions he has made within their district and around the world. Its replica will be the financial responsibility of their club forever.

The Malcolm Miller Trophy will be dropped after the Hawaiian tournament. It is agreed that the C.D. Tinsley Trophy will replace the Malcolm Miller Trophy.

A venue report and voting on future locations followed:

- (1) Luxembourg August 7-13th, 1977 Mr. Armand Delvaux, Chairman
- (2) South Africa October, 1978 Mr. B. Kantey, Chairman
- (3) California Pebble Beach May 28th June 3rd, 1979 Mr. Chuck Soper, Chairman

Gaston Barras appointed Captain of the Team. He should work closely with the Organizing Committee as concerns handicaps, pairings, etc. His arrival a few days prior to competitions would be advisable.

The Secretary of I.G.F.R. is to be responsible for seeing to it that the permanent trophies and their replicas are received yearly by the Organizing Committee prior to the competitions.

There is to be one full day's meeting of the Committee prior to the competitions, so that the business at hand could be fully discussed.

Bill McCune presented the working copy of the history of the I.G.F.R. Corrections and additions were made.

The elevation of Officers of I.G.F.R. to eventual President was discussed. It was agreed that the Officers be elected to each position as they become available.

All members of the Executive Committee were reconfirmed with the following exceptions: Tom Dickson and Tamey Arakawa. Their resignations were accepted with regrets:

To replace Mr. Arakawa, Mr. Ichiro Hattori was elected. His address will be:

Ichiro Hattori 4-5-31 Minamiazabu Minato-Ku Tokyo, Japan It was agreed that in the rules and regulations classifications of officers and members, that there should be a third list which would include members of the Executive Committee who have served with honor in the past, and that this classification would be called a Past Service.

1977 - LUXEMBOURG

On the question of Area Fellowship it was agreed that the sum of \$1 American which should have been paid to the treasurer of I. G. F. R. be dropped.

Doubt was again expressed about the information regarding the tournament reaching the interested Rotarians and members were reminded that they should seek for and take advantage of any opportunity for spreading information.

Publicity material for all meetings should contain a list of past service members of the Executive, giving their office and years of service.

The President (Charles Piat) announced his retiral from office and the members expressed their thanks for valued and much appreciated service to I.G.F.R.

The Secretary (Willie Milne) also confirmed his retiral.

Joe Gherzi (Italy) announced his retiral from the Executive and this was accepted with regret. He asked that Franco Agostini, the Resident of Italian Fellowship might take his place and after discussion, members supported this suggestion and it was approved.

Malcolm Miller (USA) had announced his resignation and it was proposed and agreed that Max Wieninger (Germany) should become a member of the Executive.

Members were reminded that the rules stated that the number of members on the Executive should not exceed twenty.

Before proceeding to the question of new office bearers, the meeting approved a motion that all office bearers including members of the Executive should be confirmed in office every year, but in the case of the presidency; he could only hold office for two successive years.

On his retiral he would remain a member of the Executive Committee.

C. D. Tinsley proposed the following list of Office Bearers:

President W. A. P. Milne, Scotland

Vice President Armand Delvaux, Luxembourg

Secretary Jack Bushong, USA Treasurer Jack Grey, Australia

This was agreed and all those concerned agreed to accept office — in the case of the President elect for one year only.

Jim Anderson's letter was discussed and it was thought that the broadening of the rules to include a fellowship flight would give other Rotarians the opportunity to take part in the meeting, if not in the main tournament.

Rotarians may enter this section without district qualification and their entry will be accepted up to the limit of the facilities available. In the event of their District not being fully represented they may then take a place in the tournament, proper provided the rules of district representation (one member in each class) are observed.

The Executive approved without reservation the letter which Carl Miller has written to Kenneth Switzer of Rotary International, regarding his comments on the name, the badge and the publicity material of I.G.F.R., and asked the Secretary to write to Carl, stating that they should be very grateful if he were to take up the whole matter of Rotary Fellowship Activities with Rotary International. It was the opinion of everyone that his assistance would be invaluable.

The insurance of trophies was discussed and the Secretary reported that the insured value of all trophies had been increased by 50% subject to valuation, excluding the C.D. Tinsley Trophy which had been covered for a sum of L 500. The total sum now stood at L 3,498. The C.D. Tinsley Trophy being too big to transport, would be kept in Houston and therefore would be dropped from the Insurance Policy.

Bill McCune raised the question of the new edition of the History of I.G.F.R. and discussed the question of costs. Ichiro Hattori (Japan) said that he would be delighted to look after the production costs and his offer was accepted with acclamation.

It was confirmed that the tournament would be held in Hermanus, South Africa, in 1978, Pebble Beach, California, in 1979; and subject to the necessary documents being sent to the Secretary, in Crans sur Sierre, Switzerland, in 1980.







The history of I.G.F.R. was completed prior to the meeting and shipped to Hermanus. It was agreed to sell them for U.S. \$3.00.

Each member expressed deep appreciation to Ichiro Hattori for his unselfish generosity in personally paying for the publication.

The secretary was instructed to thank Historian Bill McCune for his efforts and to ask that "supplements" be published every two or three years.

The secretary read a letter from the solicitor of Gavin Reekie as concerns the founder of I.G.F.R. Two conclusions were reached:

- 1. Gavin expressed that the matter was not simply his concern, but rather his entire family's.
- 2. Committee expressed that the matter should be personally resolved between Gavin and Carl Miller.

It was agreed that all trophies were to be the permanent possession of the executive committee, regardless of the number of times one player may win them.

It was agreed to delay discussion on the design of the I.G.F.R. badge worn by the executives.

As to "how long a Past President could/would serve on the executive committee," a clarification of the rules and regulations indicates that any officer shall remain an active member of the executive committee as long as he wished. However, the attendance requirements of not missing two consecutive venues would apply, as it would to any committee member.

Reprinting of the Rules and Regulations and the "Fact Sheet" approved by the 'Committee.

Agreed that a permanent fellowship trophy is the discretion of the Organizing Committee.

A report was received from Gaston Barras for the 1980 Venue in Switzerland. It was received with thanks and re-confirmed.

An invitation for 1981 was presented by Ray Owen and Hugh Robison for Puerto Rico. The committee agreed to place Puerto Rico on a tentative for confirmation next year.

All executive members were reconfirmed except for Arturo Alvarez who becomes a past member not having attended the previous two venues.

It was recommended and approved that Buzz Dublin be invited to future executive committee meetings and that he receive a copy of the minutes and all correspondence by the secretary as R.I.'s representative (fellowship board) to I.G.F.R.

With much regret and a very warm and very special thanks for their past services, the Committee accepted the resignation of past president Willie Milne and executive member John Dibb, who have missed two consecutive meetings of the I.G.F.R. 
Stuart Kennedy of North Carolina was elected to the Executive Committee.

We are looking forward to seeing you again in Victoria, B.C., Canada for the 19th World Rotary Golf Championship.



However daunting the famous 'Dunes' golf course, our spirits never weakened. It was a real pleasure to play this world renowned championship golf course, an experience I will always cherish and I know that sentiment is shared by all the participants.

At the banquet dinner, our Honorary President, Carl Miller spoke to us direct by telephone over the loudspeaker system, from his home in Honolulu. It was a great joy to hear him personally speak of the immensely valuable role that our I.G.F.R. Fellowship is playing in promoting World Understanding. We all greatly regret that, because of indisposition, Carl and Ruth were unable to be with us in person and his telephone call and the thoughts behind it were all the more appreciated. Remember the 'Open' Golf Championship is being held at St. Andrews the week prior to our tournament. The closing dates for entries is April 1, 1984.

At Myrtle Beach we had a most interesting talk with Dr. Gary Wirren, Director of the National Academy of Golf, P.G.A. of America, on their scheme for a Jr. Golf Academy, with the aim to help build the future leaders of golf. Advanced and Intermediate junior golfers — boys and girls ages 12 to 17 (18 year olds just out of high school can be accepted) — can be scheduled in any one of their separate one week sessions of intense instruction with the assistance of at least one 'Star' professional. Their motto is "Training Future Leaders Through Golf" and all students have impressed on them the values of 'Honesty, Perserverance and Responsibility.' As with our own I.G.F.R. Fellowship, golf is simply the means to carry the message of "Better World Understanding." Living, learning and playing together creates this spirit of International Goodwill.

The cost this year is \$495.00 US per session and, of course, travel costs are extra. The venue is Boca West Club in Boca Raton, Florida and the sessions are late June and the month of July, 1984.

 The President Gaston BARRAS opened the meeting and welcomed two new Committee members, namely Philippe CANDAU from France and James F. HACKLER from South Carolina, U.S.A.

The Committee members observed 2 minutes' silence in memory of our friend Ichiro Hattori.


- 2. The Committee decided to send Mrs Takako HATTORI a telegram expressing their condolences and sympathy.






